
On Friday 1st July, primary students took part in a range of STEM challenges presented by students from **Sydney Technology College.**

Students took part in a range of fun activities which included creating a wind turbine and prosthetic limbs.















Aspect Assessments Fee reduction information sheet



Aspect Assessments is able to offer some assessments at a reduced fee to individuals who require financial assistance to access an initial diagnostic assessment. These assessments are able to be offered at our Sydney offices (Chatswood and Baulkham Hills), Coffs Harbour offices and via Telehealth.

To be eligible to access a fee reduction, individuals must have:

Low income

- For children under 18 years, parent/carer has a health care card or pension card in the parent's name
- For individuals over 18 years, individual has a health care card or pension card in their name

AND at least 1 of the below:

- Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander background
- Refugee visa status
- Culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds
- Reside in the following areas:
 - South-West Sydney (i.e., Bankstown, Camden, Campbelltown, Fairfield, Liverpool, Wingecarribee and Wollondilly LGAs)
 - Regional or remote zones of Australia- i.e. living outside a metropolitan area as defined by the Rural, Remote and Metropolitan Area (RRMA) classification. You can check whether you are located in a regional or remote area at <a href="https://www.health.gov.au/resources/apps-and-tools/health-workforce-locator/health-w

The full cost of an autism assessment is \$1,990. The amount of fee reduction and out of pocket cost depends on the age of the individual and the number of eligibility criteria that they meet. The level of fee relief available is:

Age group	Eligibility criteria	Fee reduction	Cost to individual
Children	Low income + 2 or more other eligibility criteria	100%	\$0
8 years or younger	Low income + 1 eligibility criteria	87.5%	\$250
Individuals aged 9-17 years	Low income + 1 or more other eligibility criteria	87.5%	\$250
Individuals aged 18+ years	Low income + 1 or more other eligibility criteria	75%	\$500

In addition to the above fee reduction, families with children under 13 years of age may be able to access a Medicare rebate if referred to Aspect Assessments by a paediatrician or child psychiatrist. Unfortunately, there are no Medicare rebates available for individuals 13 years or older.

Fee reductions are only available when the assessment is being paid for by the individual or their family. That is, a fee reduction is not available when the assessment is being paid for by a government agency or third party.
