NAIDOC CELEBRATIONS

This week, students and staff celebrated NAIDOC week by wearing the colours of our First Nations people and listening to our special guest speaker, Stevie Skene, who spoke about what the theme 'Get up! Stand up! Show up!' means to her before joining together for storytime.

Parents and carers were welcomed by a 'Sea of Hearts' lining the pathway into our school, with student pledges of ways they could stand up and show up to improve the rights of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. Community members joined students for a picnic lunch, open playground and a variety of activities that allowed students to engage with culture, country and with community.

At the community gathering in the afternoon Hudson Gunn read an Acknowledgement to Country. Followed by the SRC making a pledge written by Rosie Hurford, "On behalf of Forbes Public School. We make a promise to our First Nation People, both past and present, to look after this land and all the animals for emerging generations to come."

Then, we officially opened our new FPS Yarning Circle in the Community Conservation Corner (CCC). Beneath the Indiginous coloured shade sail we thanked Kathryn Currey, the Evolution Mining representative, for donating the shade sail as part of their Cowal Partnering Program.

Our murals (pickups and the water tank near the CCC) were funded by Arts Out West and the Foundation for Rural & Regional Renewal (FRRR). We commissioned Wiradjuri artist Scott (Sauce) Towney who designed our animal totems in 2019 to paint these murals that connect students to Country through language and totems: Safe (platypus), Respectful (magpie) and Responsible (Kangaroo).

Finally, we officially showcased our new School's Journey Story which is an artwork (for the front office) created in collaboration between staff and Indiginous artist Cheree Stokes. It is a snapshot of our school's past, present and future. Rosie interviewed Cheree about this year's NAIDOC theme, her inspirations, highlights working with FPS staff and what our school's Journey Story meant to her.

A special thank you to the local community for supporting and participating in our school's NAIDOC celebrations. It was fantastic to have so many community members add their handprints to our collaborative artwork that symbolises our meeting place where community gathers together.

It was a lovely morning and we saw lots of familiar faces.




