

#### **Healing Dots Workshops with Indigenous Elder Cheree Stokes**

Thanks to a grant from FRRR (Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal), Indigenous artist Cheree Stokes ran a whole-school Healing Dots Workshop. Each child painted raised dots on palm-sized boards. These sensory pads will remain in the classrooms for years to come to support students to soothe and calm themselves by rubbing their fingers over the dots. You can view these Healing Dots at our exhibition on Thursday, 29 June, as part of our Community NAIDOC celebration.



#### **Our Journey Story**



Before the flood, we commissioned Indigenous artist Cheree Stokes to depict our Forbes Public School journey story using symbols and words provided by us.

The tree was a common theme and continues to symbolise our school's ability to do hard things.

We survived the flood, the lead-up, the devastation and the aftermath because of our strong roots. These roots symbolise the hard work done by the previous staff; these roots run deep into a century of Forbes Public School values, local connections and traditions and are reinforced by a commitment to PBL and Stronger Smarter.

A whole-school teams-based approach has empowered staff and students to be leaders and take responsibility for our own well-being and the well-being of the land. The fact that we had 3 full kindergarten classes with enough faith in us to send their children here after we became non-operational at the end of last year is a testament to the high-quality community relationships we fostered throughout Covid, where we thrived amongst challenges.

The solid trunk symbolises our resiliency. After the flood, we felt betrayed by the land and elements, so to rebuild this connection, we called in 3 Wiradjuri Elders and each class worked together to create a bush tucker garden in the form of a huge platypus. The sharing of dreamtime stories, digging, planting and creating healed our trauma and restored our connection to country.

The branches and leaves symbolise reaching out into the town. On Thursday, we are hosting a community NAIDOC day to celebrate what Forbes has achieved post-flood. We will gather to sing, dance, play, paint and share food supported by Wiradjuri elders and 16 Indigenous service providers. On this day, we will acknowledge our symbiotic connection to country - for all it takes and for all it gives and we will acknowledge that we have returned to a state of balance.

#### **Community Conservation Corner**

Over the last 2 weeks, Elders Rob Sloane and Peter White have been working with the whole school to develop a bush tucker garden in our Community Conservation Corner. Sauce, the Elder, who created our safe, respectful and responsible animal totems, returned to paint the platypus on the ground to be cut out and filled with gravel and rocks.

Students planted native trees, succulents and edible plants. They loved building a humpy and a camp to play in and practise Aboriginal lore. Special thanks to Boys to the Bush, Daniel from Snap Plumbing, Tony from Tony McManus Tree Service, Outback Soils, the P and C and all the community contributors. We thank Central West Local Land Services for their generous grant.





# Keeping your children safe when dropping off and picking up at school

Here are a few things you can do to help keep your children and others safer during drop-off and pick-up times during the school week:

- Make sure your children are fastened in the correct child car seat for their age and size and that it is fitted correctly.
- Stick to the 40km/h speed limit in a school zone and look out for children who may be about.
- Watch for flashing lights on buses. They let you know that there may be children crossing or about to cross the road. A 40km/h limit applies when school bus lights flash.
- Always give way to pedestrians particularly when entering and leaving driveways.

- Always park and turn legally around schools.
   Manoeuvres such as U-turns and three-point turns are dangerous during busy school drop-off and pick-up times.
- Drop your children off and pick them up on the school side of the road in your school's designated drop-off and pick-up area. Never call out to them from across the road they may run to you without checking for traffic.
- It's safest for children to get out of the car through the Safety Door, away from passing traffic. This is the rear footpath side door of the car.

#### NO STOPPING signs

You must not stop in a No Stopping zone at any time.

If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction applies only at these times.

Fine exceeds \$362 + 2 demerit points



#### **BUS ZONE signs**

You must not stop within a Bus Zone at any time. If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction applies only at that time.

Fine exceeds \$362 + 2 demerit points



#### NO PARKING signs

You can stop in this zone for a maximum of **2 minutes** to drop off or pick up passengers or goods

You must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle at all times.

These signs may be supplementary signposted with a 'Kiss & Ride' sign.



Fine exceeds \$201 + 2 demerit points



#### Double parking

Double parking causes a real safety risk to children and other road users.

Do not double park to pick up, drop off or for any reason.

Fine exceeds \$362 + 2 demerit points

#### Other behaviours to avoid:

- · Parking in an intersection;
- Parking across driveways;
- · Parking too close to corners; and
- Stopping on crossings.



# **Accidental Counsellor**



The Lifeline Accidental Counsellor course equips participants with the essential skills and structure to:

Recognise when a person is in crisis.

**Respond** in an appropriate and compassionate manner.

**Refer** the person to a suitable service.

Have you ever found yourself supporting a customer, client, friend, family member, colleague or even a stranger who is experiencing distress or a crisis, and you aren't sure what to say? Our **Accidental Counsellor workshop** equips participants with the skills and knowledge to respond appropriately in these situations.

Learning how to 'Recognise, Respond and Refer' helps participants build their confidence to support someone in distress or experiencing a crisis. Participants will learn effective communication skills, ask directly about thoughts of suicide and respond safely, whatever the answer. It defines the role of an "Accidental Counsellor" and includes a self-care module to ensure their own wellbeing.

This Face to face workshop is delivered by Lifeline Trainers.

No pre-existing skills or knowledge are required. (age 16+)
