In the Junior Boys 50 m breaststroke Miles Turner (on the right) broke B. Jayet's 1970 53.90 record by 3 seconds in a time of 51.07!

In the next heat Jack Pointon (on the left) won the event in a time of 49.34 breaking Miles's new record by nearly 2 seconds!



Leo Dwyer and Jamaraki Ware both broke J. Dunlop's 2007 11 years boys 50 m freestyle record.

The previous record was 34.49 seconds.

Jamaraki came second in a time of 33.85 and Leo won the event in a time of 33.37 - over a second under the old record which is outstanding over such a short distance!! Congratulations boys!

After breaking the 50 m freestyle record, Leo went on to break another 4 records.

In the boys 11 years 50 m backstroke he broke J. Ware's 2020 45.01 seconds record in a time of 42.25 (almost 3 seconds)!



In the 50 m butterfly, Leo broke another one of Jakieal Ware's records - the 2020 record was 39.11 and Leo did a 38.6.

In the 200 m Individual Medley Leo broke another one of Jakieal's records - the 2021 record was 3:15.32 minutes and Leo did a time of 3:15.02 minutes.

In the senior boys relay Leo was part of the Kurrajong team that beat the 2016 Wilga record. The old time was 2.46.12 minutes and the boys did a 2.45.88 minutes.

Well done Leo, 5 records in one day is outstandingly good!!



This Kurrajong relay team broke a school record again! Last year they broke a the junior record and this year they broke the senior record held by Wilga since 2016!!



Forbes Sportsperson Of the Year Award (SOYA) Awards 2023

On Saturday, 24th March 2024 SOYA awards were presented and Forbes Public School (FPS) and their students did outstandingly.

Forbes Shire Council Fair Go Award

Forbes Public School won the Forbes Shire Council Fair Go Award. This award is chosen by Forbes Shire Council and is presented to an organisation within our community that is inclusive and accepting of all participants regardless of their race, gender, religion or ability. They promote fair play and sportsmanship at all times and provide a safe environment for their members, families and friends. This is an outstanding sporting achievement - well done to all FPS staff and students.



The Cahill's Footwear School Awards

Each year local schools nominate a student who has achieved outstanding results in the sporting arena. **Max Pointon** won this award for Forbes Public School – Max is an outstanding sportsperson who achieved fantastic results at school and in the school community in 2023. Max's major sporting achievements for 2023 were representing the Western Region at State Championships in several different sports including Swimming, U/11 Rugby League, AFL and Touch. He was awarded the R H Lytton Memorial Award for 2023 at the FPS Annual Presentation for "Sporting Excellence". Congratulations Max.

The Phillip Adams Encouragement Award is presented to a sportsperson who shows exceptional talent in their chosen sport and is well on their way to achieving sporting excellence. This year it was won by Jack Pointon. Jack's major sporting achievement for 2023 was when he placed 7th in the State in the 9 years boys 50m freestyle, 10th in the State as part of the Western All Age 5 x 50m relay team and was part of the Forbes Public School Junior Boys Relay Team who placed 7th overall in the State at the NSW PSSA Swimming Championships. Jack was Age Champion with Forbes Finns, playing Touch in both Forbes and Parkes competitions. He represented Lachlan at the Western PSSA Trials and was selected in the Parkes Pumas U12's Representative team as an 8 year old for the 2022/2023 season and again as a 9 year old for the 2023/2024 season. Jack represented Forbes Public School at Lachlan and Western PSSA trials for Cross Country. Great work Jack.

The Forbes Sportsperson of the Year Association Merit Awards are awarded to nominees based on the level of their achievements in their chosen field. Anderson McMahon was awarded a Merit award in 2023. He showed his talents at Athletics in 2023. At the annual school Athletics carnival he placed in the 11 Years 100m, 200m, 800m, 1500m, High Jump, Long Jump and the Senior Boys Relay. He came 1st in Long Jump, High Jump, 200m & Senior Boys Relay at the Lachlan PSSA Trial. At the Western PSSA Trials Anderson came 1st in the Long Jump, 2nd in the High Jump and 3rd in the 200m which earned him his place to compete at the State PSSA Athletics titles. Anderson finished 9th in the High Jump and 14th in the Long Jump at the State competition which was an outstanding achievement. Well done Anderson.

The Forbes Sport & Recreation Club Coach/Trainer Award recognises the many people, usually volunteers, who ensure that players and participants are taught the correct skills and techniques and have a fitness level for performance results and injury prevention. This year this award was won by Hannah DeMamiel. Hannah coached the Forbes Public School Athletics relay teams. All four teams made the Western PSSA Team with the Junior Boys Relay Team coming 26th in the State. Hannah selflessly gave up her time to hold weekly training sessions for all students who made Lachlan/Western and State. Hannah is also the President of Forbes Little Athletics Club and coaches members at every opportunity. Thank you Hannah.

The 2023 Forbes All Round Sports Achiever was Leo Dwyer.

Leo is a young swimmer making serious waves in the pool this year. At the Forbes Public School Annual Swimming Carnival, Leo was 1st in the All Age Boys 100 m, 10 Years Boys 50 m Freestyle, Junior Backstroke, Junior 50 m butterfly, Junior 200 m Individual Medley, Boys Junior 4 x 50 m relay 2 nd in the Junior Boys Breastroke. Leo broke a record in 2 events - the 50 m butterfly from 2017, and the Junior Boys Relay that broke a record from 1988. At the Lachlan PSSA Swimming Team trials, Leo qualified for the Lachlan PSSA Team to go to the Western PSSA Swimming Team Trials and also qualified to go to the Western PSSA where he qualified for the Western PSSA Team to compete at the PSSA State Titles in numerous events. Leo competed in his first competition in the Redlands Cup in the Alpine. He self



nominated in this event, representing Forbes Public School. Leo was Age Champion at the Forbes Fins Swimming Club. He was Age Champion at the Mountains and Plains Summer Championships held in Lithgow. The Mountains and Plains area is from Glenbrook to the East, out to Lake Cargelligo to the West, Rylstone to the North and Cowra to the South, including Bathurst, Orange. Leo Represented the NSW Mountains and Plains region at the Brophy Swim held at the Australian Institute of Sport in Canberra and qualified to compete at the Speedo Sprint series and the NSW Junior State Age Championships. Leo is equally comfortable on land as he is in the water. He represented his school and Lachlan area for a number of events for Athletics, Tennis, Cross Country, Touch, Rugby League, Soccer, AFL, Snow Skiing & Cricket. Leo also plays in local competitions as well as earning representative honours. He was the Lachlan district Junior Rugby League Under 10's runner up Best & Fairest, played in the Under 10's side who were Minor Premiers and Grand Finalists and won the Under 10's Coaches Award. In the Forbes Junior Cricket Club he was opening batter and bowler for the Under 12's team which were Minor Premiers and Premiers. He was named Under 12's Bowler of the year. He represented Forbes in the Under 12's side and was opening batter and bowler for this team as well. Leo competes in the Forbes & the Parkes Touch Associations Summer competitions and is a Parkes Puma representative player for 2023/24 season and competed at the state championships. Congratulations Leo.

The Walker's Ag N Vet Team Award is presented to the team who in the judges' opinion, has achieved success at a high level in their chosen field. The 2023 Team Award was won by FPS Junior Boys Swimming Relay Team. Members were: Leo Dwyer, Jack Pointon, Jamaraki Ware and Miles Turner. The Forbes Public Junior Boys relay team finished 8th at the NSW PSSA carnival at Homebush in April. All 4 swimmers are Forbes FINS club members, and the team was the only regional team in the final. Following the Lachlan Trials, the team qualified first in Dubbo with a time of 2.40.88 and won the event by 12.11 seconds in a time of 2.36.84. Their Dubbo time would have ranked them 9 th at last year's NSW PSSA State Titles - however, at Dubbo they had to push off the wall at the second and fourth changeover, which would mean this time is slower than their potential - had each swimmer been permitted to dive. This team had the following results at the school representative carnivals 1. Won at Condobolin, Lachlan region. 2. Won at Dubbo, Western Region. Time of 2.36 which was 12 seconds ahead of 2nd place 3. Qualified 7th fastest for the State finals at Homebush which includes every Primary School in NSW (both private and state schools). Time 2.29. 4. Placed 8th out of 10 in the Final at Homebush. Time 2.31. 5. Also adding to the achievement is that most if not all teams in the final consisted of 4 x 10 years olds. This team competed against them with 2 x 10 year olds, 1 x 9 year old and 1 x 8 year old. Great effort boys.


